

The Council as followeth.

By the House of Delegates A^d November 5th 1712,
The House have Consider'd the endorsement of the Honble Council on the
Bill relating to the Act for returning some Aggrievances and more
expected your Hon^d would have return'd the same with such an
endorsement considering the little time we desire this Act to continue
if that Act at first was just contrary to her Majestys Royall instruc-
tions it was no fault in this House they having obeyd those that
then took'd upon them the Government and were cannot but believe
your Hon^d have certified her Majesty the reason why the Acts pass'd
under that title being induced thereto by her Majestys not dis-
approving as well those made Anno 57th 0, as those made Anno 57th 9
and we also remember the interest made against this Bill more
than any other at the time of passing it and the confidence some
gentlemen then had of having it return'd disallowed of in a little
time all which we see vanish'd in its continuing the time it was
made for.

Your Hon^d are not insensible we concurred to your request to have
the Act for Officers free till after the arrivall of a Cap^r General
not being willing to enter into long debates about it —

If this Bill curtaileth the Jurisdiction of the Courts we think that
objection may be easily obviated considering the great oppression
her Majestys poore Subjects Labour under by the unreasonableness
of their attendance on the Provinciall Courts and the great fees
that are there taken —

We believe the Honble President hath now as full instruction
as any Cap^r General can expect to pass any Bills of absolute necessity
being invested with a Negative voice, And if your Hon^d will after
your own Authority and the dignity of your Board to removethis
and other great Aggrievances we have to Lay before you will be no
breach but a performance of your duty to her Majestys wall and not
signed intent and desire to breake the Country in which you have a
great interest and more reputation then you are ready to insist on and
deny any thing that tends to easse the Inhabitants of this Province
when this faire intercess with the interest of some particular per-

But if your Hon^d think it more necessary and will consern that
new Bill may be past to remedie those Aggrievances (tho' under the
other title) we shall readily concire with you therin, if not we desire
may not stay here to no purpose and spend our time and the Count-
