The Honble John Hall Esq^r The Alderson and Thudmon Hoyd Esq^r and Col Rich^d Tilghman are appointed by us to confer with the Conferences from your House on the subject matter desired at this time and said appointed and are now ready to focus with your Members on that conference Signed & order Wladden & Council

Ordered the Members appointed by this House go out on the Conference Afterwards the Gent^l of the Conference entered the House and delivered M^r Speaker the following Report,

The Conference are humbly of opinion that it's absolutely necessary that a Bill be brought in for regulating Writs of Error and granting appeals from and to the Courts of Common Law within this Province and that the said Bill be in all respects agreeable to the former Law for Appeals and regulating Writs of Error — excluding that paragraph relating to Appeals from the High Court of Chancery to the Govern^r and Council

The said Conference are likewise of opinion that a Clause be added to the said Bill to restrain all appeals from the Decrees of the High Court of Chancery to the Queen and Council in England unless the sum amount to three hundred pounds Ster^l or sixty thousand pounds of Tobacco — Signed & order Edm^d Benson & Council

Upon Reading the above report of the Conference the House therewith concurred and Resolved a Bill be brought in accordingly
