Bill confirming Coll Courts his will by speciall order Read the first and second times and will pass.

Put up to the Honble Council by Mr Hoskins Mr Storey, Mr Kendall and Mr Sprigg — They returne and say they delivered the Bill.

Resolved a Message be sent to the Council concerning the Assembly Office by Coll
