The House met again according to Adjournment being called
over were all present as yesterday (except M^r Worthington who
is sick) Read what was done yesterday

The Address Order'd to be prepared yesterday brought into the
House, Read approved and Order'd to be entered as follows

To the Honble Edward Lloyd Esq President of her Majtys
Honble Council of Maryland and Commander in Chief thereof
We the Deputies and Delegates of the said Province now in
Assembly convened,

In most dutifull and humble manner crave leave to lay before
your Hono^t the great griefe and affliction that possesse us in
finding the Conference between the Members of her Majestys
Honble Council and the members of this House break up without
making a finall end and conclusion of the matter to them referred in
the Article for limiting the Jurisdiction of the Provinciall Court in
small sums, we cannot impute the waife therof to any thing
but a constant resolution in her Majestys Honble Council not to
concur with any thing that fromingly touches her most sacred
Majestys Royall prerogative (which they are obliged to maintain
and) which this House never designs to wrench or infringe knowing
your Hono^t ever since your taking upon you the Government ^{to}
^{thereof} to be very carefull and tender, But the Deplorable and sad co-
dition her Majestys good Subjects of this Province ^{would} be under shew
this present Session of Assembly and without passing the Act for
relieving some aggrievances makes us now address your Hono^t for
relief therein.

We are very sensible her Majestys has restricted your Hono^t from
passing any Bills of moment w^tout of absolute necessity for the
welfare peace and tranquillity of this Province in the absence
of a Capt^l General and most humbly desire your Hono^t to extend as
