By the Hon^{ble} President and Council in Assembly Novemb^r 8. 1752
The Hon^{ble} President having communicated to us your Address to him for reversing the Law for allowing the Inhabitants of this Province from some Grievances they lie under and our sentiments agreeing with yours that in case such a Law is not now past many good planters will desert their abodes and others to avoid imprisonment will be induced to resist Justice and seek in the woods whereby the happy Peace and tranquillity of this Province may be endangered, we have been inclined to advise his Hon^{or} to consent to the reversing the said Law for the time proposed purely to avoid the Mischiefs aforesaid, To which he is pleased to give way.
