We have Consider'd and debated the Message and Bill sent from your Honble Board yesterday by Col. Whittington and John Hall Esq. relating to the Indians but not being satisfied of the reasons induc'd your Honors to recommend that Bill as it is drawn and taking the same to be of no great concernment and being willing to shew our respect to what comes from your Honble Board have thought it reasonable to agree to the Bill first Paragraph therof with these Amendments viz. (for Recovery of the Penalty in any County Part of this Province and that it may be to the use of the County) But as last paragraph therof relating to false Rumours we think it may be wholly rejected for that it will be of ill consequence— And we are
