

By the Council in Assembly Novemb<sup>r</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 1752 —  
 Read in Council and his consideration thereof referred to the  
 next Session of Assembly — Signed & Order W Bladen C<sup>o</sup> C<sup>o</sup>  
 Upon Reading his said Indorsement Ordered the Bill be again  
 indorse — By the House of Delegates 52<sup>nd</sup> November 1752 —  
 We take this Bill to be of Absolut necessity therefore cannot  
 agree with your Hon<sup>d</sup> in referring it till another Session but  
 Earnestly intreat your Hon<sup>d</sup> to consider of it now that it may be  
 Enacted this Session — Sign'd & Order R Dallam C<sup>o</sup> H<sup>d</sup> D<sup>o</sup>.

Ordered those two last Bills be carried up to the Council by Mr Tyte  
 Mr John Mackall, Mr Hill, Mr Broms, Mr Leach Mr James Mackall  
 Mr Jones Mr Hammond, Mr Marriates and Mr Docwra. —

They return and say they deliver'd the Bills to  
 The Honble Col<sup>l</sup> Greenberry and Col<sup>l</sup> Tilghman enter the House  
 and deliver to the Speaker the Journall of the Committee of Accounts —  
 and the following Message.

By the Council in Assembly Novemb<sup>r</sup> 52<sup>nd</sup> 1752 —  
 On perusal of the Journall of the Committee of Acc<sup>o</sup> we find several  
 Mistakes therein which will be remarde to you by the  
 Messengers sent therewith — We cannot see what reasons you have  
 to reject the allowances usually made the Members of this Board for their  
 Attendance and Assistance in the High Court of Chancery and recom  
 it to your consideration that thewold allowances be made them.

The Honble President Advanced ten Dollars to Mr Brook the  
 Messenger sent from Virg<sup>a</sup> by Goverour Spotswoods Express with the  
 publick packetts and her Majestys proclamation for the Exaction of  
 Arms agreed with France which money we desire may be repaid  
 His Hon<sup>d</sup> out of the Treasury — Signed & Order W Bladen C<sup>o</sup> C<sup>o</sup>  
 Upon reading and debating this Message Ordered the Journall be  
 rectified and the Message Answered as follows. —

By the House of Delegates 52<sup>nd</sup> Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1752 —  
 We have ordred the Errors in the Journall of the Committee of Acc<sup>o</sup>  
 to be rectified — and the Honble Presidents ten Dollars to be allowed  
 him — But as to allowing such of your Hon<sup>d</sup> Acc<sup>o</sup> as attended  
 the Court of Chancery we cannot allow them it being contrary to the  
 Act of Assembly — and we are of opinion that the proffit of the  
 Office of keeping the Books is sufficient to defray the charge and  
 expences of the Judges there w<sup>t</sup>out burthening the publick
