By the House of Delegates, Novemb<sup>r</sup>. 13<sup>th</sup>. 1752. Upon Reading this Bill this day we observe the clause in § 2: is contrary to the intent of your Hono.<sup>d</sup> and this House as the Messengers herewith sent will remark to your Hono.<sup>d</sup> wd<sup>d</sup> desire the same may be amended by leaving out the Cause and adding the new one which we conceive fully agrees with your and our intentions.
