

The Honble Coll. Green and Coll Addison enter the House and deliver Mr Speaker the following Message
 By the Council in Assembly November 24th 1752
 Gents - In answer to your Message desiring to know on what terms we should accept of his rents in Town as it now stands with his Lordships we shall not take upon us to prescribe Rules to your House, but as you more immediately represent the people if you think it advisable to write to his Lordship to know his inclinations upon what terms he will be pleased to settle the Rents, for himself his heirs and Successors you may use your discretion.

Ingress Bill relieving the Inhabitants from some Aggravances they are under in prosecution of suits in Law.

Ingress Bill restraining the Inhabitants from selling great Quantities of Liquors to the Indians &c.

Ingress Bill being a Supplement to the Act for punishment of Adultery and Fornication &c.

All these three Ingress Bills read and severally indorsed 24th November 1752. Read and Assented to by the House of Delegates and signed Order R. Dallam C. H. Deb.

Settled up to the Honble Council by Mr Sprigg Mr Broome Mr Tripp and Mr Pearce - They returned and say they delivered the Bills Coll Addison and John Dorsey Esq. enter the House and deliver Mr Speaker the aforesaid three Ingress Bills sent up this Day Severally indorsed November 24th 1752 -
