

In the House and Council in Assembly 29th October 1753.
 In Answer to your Message by Col^t Hastings and five other of your
 Members we have not yet had reason to communicate to us
 of their late regard had to the Address of your Gov^r & we shall do you tax us
 with as to our advice of addressing Her Majesty in relation to the
 Laurence's instant and employing an Agent to take care of the
 Lower Province and desire we should agree with you in such address
 and recommend to you a capable person to serve the Country on this
 occasion Her Majestys having Expre^{sly} declared by Royall will and
 pleasure in favour of S^r Thomas Laurence we do not think fit to
 goe in any disorder Contrary to her pleasure so often and so particularly
 declared by her selfe and ord^d in Council And th^e we think it absolutely
 necessary for the good and welfare of the Province and should be heartily
 glad to joyn with you in appointing a capable person to be agent for
 and represent his Province on all occasions but if we shoule concur
 to appoint an Agent particularly on th^e it would seeme in us a
 manifest opposition of her Majestys Commands Wherefore we cannot
 agree to the Conference desired and therefore once more earnestly
 desire you will maturely and with the greatest caution consider what
 may be the ill consequences of refusing a due compliance to her M^t
 most sacred Commands now before you Signed Hord. W^rden Esq^r
 upon reading the aforesaid Message Orderd it be Answer'd as follows -

By the House of Delegates October 29th 1753. —
 In our Message by Col^t Hastings and others we did not tax your Hon^s
 with any disregard had by you of any of our Addresses but Complain
 of some hardness we lay under the want of having their Address pro^p
 nized and were sent in acquainted your Hon^s with our Re^solve of addre^s
 sing Her Majest^y relating to S^r Thos Laurence And upon reading your
 Message referred thereto S^r before relating to an Agent Relied upon
 the existing one on all occasions and thought your Hon^s do not
 think fit to send with us in the Address but we know you will concur
 with us in the appointing an Agent and agree to the Conference
 desired for that purpose and do not but we shall give your Hon^s
 full Demonstrations of our Duty and Obedience to her Majest^y Com-
 mands as will be to your satisfaction, Siquid^d Order R^o D^r P^r
 to the Council for Mr^r Ward, Mr^r Washington, Mr^r Tyler, Cap^r Jones,
 Mr^r John Marshall and Col^t Hastings, These are to be paid by them
 before the passage. The Council have given the same from the Council on to
 House and send Mr^r Foster the following Message.
