as he shall be Commissarie and there pay the same to such person as he shall
be directed by the Committee for apportioning the publick Levys and humbly
prays the Consideration of this Honble House in the premises. And as in
duty bound he will pray.

We have read and Considered the written petition and conceive its very
reasonable the Treasurer at present receive the mony in Gold from the Naval
Officer as he hastaken it all the Members of His House being willing to take
it at the same rate from him if you please them. And as to the latter part
of the petition we think it very generously offered by the petitioner to save
the Country the Charge of shroff Cut and that the Treasurer is such an
Officer whom we ver well sharde being of no other Service then to make his
punis to have and impose upon them of which we are not without proof
and if all the Naval Officers give good Security for performance of his
Duty we are very willing to discharge the Country of the Treasurer's liability
of five £^l but to which we desire the concurrence of the Honble Council
and that they please to lett this House know what Security the proposed
