 if you are bred to reverse the Act imposing these sums of money
 to the Country, you will find the Naval Officers are obliged to receive
 that Duty and account therefor and pay the same to the pub-
 lick Treasurers as to the appointing and discharging the Treasurers
 if you should persist in your Opinion of your absolute Authority
 therein we wish you well to consider how far you are able to proceed
 without the Concurrence of this Board - Signed Forc. W. Lazen & Co.
