The Hon^{ble} Col^t Greenbury and Col^t H^r Puttington enter their House and deliver
M^r Speaker the following Message. By the Council in Assembly 9. o. 5753
We cannot be of your sentiments either that it should be very ill convenient
a Member of this Board should be a publick Treasurer, or that the present Treas^r
of the Western Shore has bore him selfe so high upon this being a Council To deter
any person from access to him or any wise thought himselfe above being
accountable to your House but that the inconveniences hinted from his
being so are hardly imaginary. When the publick Stock is overdrawn in
the Treas^r hands scarce any will advance their own money without some
reasonable Consideration therefore, we have no objection to M^r Youngs
Integrity or diligence yet if you are fully Rejoyced to recommend new Treas^r
ers upon your offering fit and proper persons for that Trust we shall be
ready to Concur with you Signed M^r Bladen C^t Council.

Which being Read and Considered Resolved it be Answered as follows

By the House of Delegates 4. November 1753. Our sentiments
relating to the present Treas^r are not imaginary or Groundless nor is it only
when the publick Stock is overdrawn that advance money is required for
prompt paym^t. But to shew your Hon^{ble} we have no particular grudge or
ill will ag^t those Gent^l men notwithstanding the Complaints made to us we doe
