The Honble Coll Greenbery and Coll Whittington enter the House and deliver
 M^r Speaker the following Message. By the Council in Assembly 9th 4th 1753
 We cannot be of your sentiments either that it should be very ill convenient
 a Member of this Board should be a publick Treasurer, or that the present Treas^r
 of the Western Shore has bore himself so high upon his being a Council. To deter
 any person from accept to him or anywise thought himself above being
 accountable to your House but that the inconveniencies hinted from his
 being so are hardly imaginary; When the publick Stock is overdrawn in
 the Treas^r hands scarce any will advance their own money without some
 reasonable Consideration Therefore, we have no objection to M^r Youngs
 Integrity or diligence yet if you are fully Resolved to recommend new Treasur^{ers}
 upon your offering fit and proper persons for that Trust we shall be
 ready to concur with you Signed Order Wbladen C^o Counc^o.

Which being Read and Considered Resolved it be Answered as follows
 By the House of Burgesses 4th Novemb^r 1753. — Our sentiments
 relating to the present Treas^r are not imaginary or Groundless nor is it only
 when the publick Stock is overdrawn that advances money is required for
 prompt paym^t. But to show your Hon^{rs} we have no particular grudge or
 ill will ag^t those Gov^r. notwithstanding the Complains made to us we doe
