 By the Presid^t and Council in Assembly Novemb^r. 4. 1753
 We cannot but recommend to your Consideration the services of the Honble
 Col^l. W. Holland Col^l. Tho: Smith and the late Honble. Cheseloyne Esq. &
 other Gents. that were appointed by the late Gov^r. to Ride the Circuits &
 Act as Judges of the Assizes. The said Gents. we are satisfied were at
 great expences & trouble on that Occasion and could not deny the Com^{ms}
 of the Govern^{mt}. then impos'd upon them and which were in pursuance
 of her Majesty's directions to the Gov^r. We desire you will consider the
 Hardships they lay under, not having dar'd to deny the Execution of the
 Com^{ms}. and since the Charge of the Prov^l. Courts was consider^{ly} expens'd thereto
 not suffer private vend^{ts}. and their Estates to be damaged in the public
 Service but make them reasonable Compensation for their Troubles and
