The Hon^{ble} Col^t Cullalls Col^t Greenberry and John Hall Esq^r from

By the Presid^r and Council in Assembly November 4th 1753 —
We cannot but recommend to your Consideration the Services of the Hon^{ble}
Col^t W^m Holland Col^t Tho^s Smith and the late Gen^r Col^t Copeclown Esq^r &
other Gent^ls that were appointed by the late Gov^r to Ride the Circuits &
Act as Judges of the Assizes. The said Gent^ls we are satisfied were at
great expences & trouble on that Occasion and could not deny the Com^r of
the Government then imposed upon them and which were in pursuance
of their Majestys' Directions to the Gov^r. We desire you will consider the
hardships they underwent not having dare to deny the Execution of the
Com^r and since the Charge of the Prov^r Courts was considerably reduced there
no suffer much damage and their Estates to be damaged in the publick
service but make them reasonable Compensation for their Trouble and
