-bly and as oft denied any Allowance That Constitution being made
without the Consent of this House who alwayes saw the ill Consequence
thereof and though you are pleas'd to say the Charge of the Prov. Court
was Considerably less'n'd thereby yet we are certain the Charges brought in
and demanded from the Publick were much augmented what hould
& expences these Gent^ls. were at on Occasion of Riding the Circuits or
what Damages they may suffer in their Estates thereby this House were
never the occasion of and as they never on behalf of the Publick requested
or Acquiesced in any thing relating to those Com^{rs} for the Apizes but
alwayes shew'd their Aversion thereto so they think it very unreasonable
the Country should be burthens'd with the Charge But that those that
sett them to work ought to pay them for their Charges hould and
