The Honble Sec<sup>r</sup> Eunalls (S<sup>r</sup>) Tilghman enters the House and deliver  
 M<sup>r</sup> Speaker. Bill for relief of voters and ascertaining the Manner  
 of Tenders in Tobacco Indorst. By the C<sup>o</sup> in Assembly 5<sup>th</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1753  
 The Honble for Majesty's Council concur to pass this Bill with the  
 Amendment and doe desire that a severate Bill may be drawn & pass this  
 Session for punishing such as shall be guilty of false packing Tobacco  
 as proposed by the House. Signed W<sup>m</sup> Pitten (S<sup>r</sup>) Council.

Read again and the Amendment proposed agreed to & order'd to be indorst  
 5<sup>th</sup> Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1753. Read a gain in the House & pass for ingrossing and  
 Order'd the Committee of Law prepare and bring in a Bill against false  
 + packing Tobacco &c. R Dullam (S<sup>r</sup> D<sup>r</sup>) Resolved that every  
 person that reports a petition for a private Bill to pass for their  
 relief pay to the C<sup>o</sup> of this House the Antient fee of 200<sup>l</sup>. Tobacco and for  
 all Copy<sup>s</sup> of such petitions or other private matters from the Jour-  
 nals of this House the same fees the Secty charges in the proo<sup>d</sup> Court  
 for Copy<sup>s</sup> from the records there with the arrears thereof accordingly.  
 The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning Nine a Clock.

Friday 6<sup>th</sup> Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1753.

 time and will pass. Sent up to the Council by M<sup>r</sup> Brooks and M<sup>r</sup>  
 Woolford, They returns and say they deliver'd the same.
