 a Clerk Assistant to the Clerk of the Council and business has not been

 the Journal of Committee of Accounts but desire that it may be returned
 that we may go upon laying the levy. the Demand for such an allowance
 we take to be a new imposition upon the Country and if there be any
 small mistakes in the Journal they may be rectified by that Committee
