W<sup>r</sup> Tyler from the Committee of Grievances enters the House and deliver'd  
W<sup>r</sup> Speaker the following Report vizt By the Committee of Grievances  
November 6<sup>e</sup> 1753 - His Excellency offered to this Committee as an grievance  
that the bounds of several parishes <sup>particular</sup> of several Countys within this  
Province are so uncertain that it caused several disputes between the  
Parishioners and Inhabitants of the said parishes they being not bounded  
by Natural bounds or otherwise which might be prevented if the Justices  
of each County or the Major part of them had power given them to  
determine such disputes as aforesaid by Ascertaining the bounds  
of such parishes for the future and cause their proceedings therein  
to be Enter'd on their County records all which is referred to the  
House Consideration of the House. And its further offered to  
this Committee as an grievance that whereas there has been several  
disputes about between the Testy and unmerciful trial is induc'd into any  
parish from Consideration of the laying the County by or  
such unmerciful trial shall remove him before his year is completed  
what part of the forty shillings belongs to him that is induc'd as aforesaid  
in him that removes as aforesaid for that year there being no  
law to determine the same all which is referred to the Consideration  
of the House. Signed Order John Banks Esq<sup>rd</sup> Com<sup>ee</sup> Read and
