yesterday. Col^t Whittington from the Council enters the House and desires
M^t Speaker his Journal of the Committee of Accounts presented to the

Greenberry and Col^t Whittington to joyne the Members of this
House to apportion the publick Levy thereupon ordered the
Members of this House joyne them.

following Message viz. — By the Hon^{ble} Pres^{nt} and Coun-
cill in Assembly November 9th 1753. —
