

The Hon^{ble} the Lords of Trade and Plantations of the 24th of July
 whereon is the following Cause viz^t The Act which we have now
 shall be consider'd at the first opportunity and our opinion
 thereupon transmitted to you In the mean time we must observe upon
 the Act for Regulating writs of Error and Granting Appeals from
 and to the Courts of Common Law within this Kingdom that by her Majesty's
 Instructions you are requir'd to endeavour to get a Law pass'd
 where the method and Limitation of Appeals from the Inferiour
 Courts to the Gov^{er} and Council may be sett'd and restrain'd But you
 are not to Enact any thing that her Majesty has already sett'd
 by her Instructions, and therefore all that Clause in the afores^d
 Act which relates to Appeals from the Govern^{or} and Council to her
 Majesty ought to be left out the same being sufficiently provided for
 as afores^d we advise you therefore to endeavour to get a new Law
 pass'd without the said Clause since we shall be oblig'd to lay the same
 before her Majesty for her disallowance. — We therefore Recommend
 to you to Resolute that Law this Session according to their Lord-
 ships kind intimation omitting the Clause directing Appeals to her
 Majesty — Signed Lord, Warden & Council. Which being read &
 Consider'd Resolved the Bill be Resolute according to their Hon^{ors}
