The House adjourns to the Council Chamber where his Excellency was pleased to make  
the following Speech to them.

Mr Speaker and your gentleman Delegates,

Since our Meeting now is by her Majestys  
especial command I do doubt not but the great good things so earnestly recom-  
mended to your serious consideration for the Good & Welfare of this Province  
will be unanimously approved of and assented to by you its Representatives  
that what her Sacred Majesty has so wisely and graciously concerted for your  
future Happiness & Grandeur may enrich yr and succeeding Generations.

Gent. No Monarch that ever swayed the English Scapre has had a more tender  
Regard for all her Subjects than her present Majesty and tho she has been engaged  
in a great chargeable war ever since her Accession to the Throne her Princely gen-  
erous Endeavours have not been confined to Britain alone but an unwearied Ben-  
-demeff is diffused over all her Majestys Colonies & Plantations abroad and more  
especially to us and our Neighbouring Planters witness her Majestys Firm  
Interposition with the Tsar of Muscovy for if that Granter Project had not been  
stopt you might in good Measuris bid adieu to the Tobacco Trade in America  
whilst the divided Interest & Sentiments of Merchants at home in Relation to  
the setting up and curing the occasion Tobacco had goodly crowned our ~~Empire~~  
Next her Majestys opening a Trade with Spain which has already so very good  
succes many Spanish Vessels have been cleared in ~~London~~ that brought their  
Wool and Commodities hither returning them with our English Manufactures  
This Trade must prove a certain Advantage to all our Plantations by the Vicinity  
and hominence of the Spanish West Indies for I would have you consider tis not a true Spaniard  
but a Spanish French King is our Enemy.
