James Saunders Esq^r from the Honble Council enters the House & delivers Mr Speaker Petition of Henry Roberts of Ann Arundel County then read Aggravance of last Night being the first Aggravance relating to the Exportation of European Goods out of this Province read and debated; and resolved by the House that it is no Aggravance. servants that work in the Ground, read and debated. Put to the Question whether white women servants shall work in the Ground or not? Carried by Majority of Voices that white women servants be excused from working in the Ground and ordered a Bill be prepared for that Purpose; and resolved the Bill take care of it next

Sent. The Lord Baltimore having complained to us of some Infringement made upon his Rights by an Act of Assembly of Maryland ascertainment the Boundaries of Land and likewise an Injury done him by another Act for joining Adm^r & Executors from double Payment of Debts and limiting the time of Payment of Obligations within that Province. We send you here inclosed Copies of his Lordships Informations upon and Objections against both the said Acts that you may consider thereof with due regard to his Lordships Rights and take such Measures thereupon as may be agreeable to Reason & Justice. So we bid you heartily farewell
