- 2^d That the Shingling is not done in a workman like manner being already loamy and in a little will be a Means to destroy both the Timber and Plastering as well as the whole Structure
- 3^d That the Dutch Work over both Back Doors ought to be taken down and amended and that all the old Plastering throughout the whole House ought to be pulled down.
- 4th That the mouldered Bricks both within and without ought to be taken out and new ones put in their Room.
