Board it is observed that the Petitioners tho' they so style themselves rather fear
to challenge than petition for a Toleration and Freedom and unhandomely charge
the General Assembly with infringing the same which they cannot have the
least Reason to offer sooner at the time of making the Act they had not even
the slightest Assurance of such Freedom or Toleration all which is of the same
Pace with the latter Part of the Petition seeming to insinuate as if her Majesty
would forget the minuted thing for the Ease & Advantage of her Subjects —

Neither has this Board any Reason to be satisfied with the Petitioners construction
of the Houses Intention which they say was until her Majestys Pleasure should
be known that they might not be disturbed in the Interval of Assemblies
But we hope we have a better Right and with better Reason to judge it was
quite contrary thereto for otherwise to what End was the Penal Act made or the
suspending one limited to eighteen Months a certain time past
