for Elections and Privileges and ordered to withdraw upon that Committee and
was delivered to them an Indenture returned by the Sheriff of Prince George
County.

Proposed by a Member whether Mr Bradley be fit to be paid for his Service on a Committee
appointed to hear and report the Difference between Col. William Holland and Capt Richard
Smith by the County or not? And resolved the said Article satisfy the same.
The Committee of Elections and Privileges made their Report inscribed on the back of an
Indenture for Election of a Delegate for Prince Georges County as follows

April 16th 1700 By the Committee of Elections and Privileges.

It is reported to the House of Delegates that upon Examination of the within
Indenture the within mentioned Doctor Bradley appears to be duly elected to serve
as a Delegate for Prince Georges County signed by Doctor Tho. Boardley A. Com.

Ordered Mr Thomas Greenfield desire Mr Bradley to walk into the House.

Mr Bradley appears in the House and took his Place.

Ordered Mr Thomas Greenfield, Mr Lovett Tyler and Mr Nicholas Lowe attend him
to the Criminal Chamber to see him qualified.

They return and say they have seen him sworn.

Bill for Advancement of ten per cent Interest read the first Time and committed
to Committee.

The House adjourns till to morrow morning eight o'clock
