Ordered by the House that George Plator Esq, pay unto Samuel Young Esq, 200^l Sterling
within ten Days before the Fleet go out of the Province. Copy delivered him.

Mr. Bladen's Memorial brought into the House by Edward Lloyd and Wm. Coursoy Esq,
relating to Col^o Blachiston's Agency and Salary for the same

Which being read and debated the House finds there is now to Col^o Blachiston for
his Agency from the 17th Day of Sept. 1706 to the 17th Day of Sept. 1705. 120^l Sterling
which is ordered to be paid Mr. Bladen by Col^o Thomas Smith for Treasurer for the
Eastern Shore for the Use of the said Col^o Blachiston.
