Mr John Conlee, Mr John Jones and Mr Thomas Greenfield is appointed to inspect & regulate the Account of Mr Samuel Young sent to the House from the Honble Council and to make Report of their Regulation to the House

The House adjourns till two O'Clock Afternoon

By the House of Delegates Ap^e 17th 1706 Upon reading the within Message this House offer £20 for one whole Years Rent of the School-House if the Visitors of the Free School please to concur therewith.

Bill declaring several Acts of Parliament to be in force etc Read the first and second time and by special Order do pass

Indorsed Bill erecting a Parish on the North Side of Elk River etc Indorsed April 18th 1706 Read and assented to by the House of Delegates
