 Mr. John Cortoo went up to the Council with the Address and is likewise ord^r to acquaint his Excellency that this House having no matters of moment before them so that the House is ready to wait of his Excellency and her Majesty's Honble Council to conclude this Session when his Excy shall please to command them. He returns and acquaints Mr. Speaker that his Excellency says he waits their coming up to the Council Chamber. Upon which Mr. Speaker and the whole House attended his Excellency and Council at the Council Chamber and carried with him the severall Bills following which he presented to his Excellency viz:
 Bill for Advancement of Trade and erecting Ports and Towns in the Province of Maryland

- 2 A Bill encouraging the making Hemp and Flax
- 3 A Bill prohibiting the Importation of European Commodities
- 4 A Bill declaring severall Acts of Parliament of the Kingdom of England to be in force in this Province
- 5 A Bill for dividing and regulating severall Counties on the Eastern Shore and erecting a new County by the Name of Queen Anne's County
- 6 A Bill erecting a Parish on the North Side of Elk River in Cecil County
- 7 A Bill for suspending the Prosecution of Romish Priests &c
- 8 A Bill uniting New Port Hundred and William and Mary Parish in Charles County
- 9 A Bill for Naturalization of John Baptist Tyler
- 10 A Bill to sell the Freehold of Abraham Naylor applying the Money to the Uses in the Will
- 11 A Bill to make null and void a Deed from Tho^s Edmondson to W^m Edmondson.
- 12 A Bill investing certain Lands in John Whittington.
- 13 A Bill declaring the Land Law to be in force
- 14 A Bill for apportioning the publick Levy for this present Year 1706

To each of which said Bills was affixed the great Seal of this Province and his Excellency was pleased to enact the same into Laws, by underwriting every of them thus. On Behalf of her Sacred Majesty Queen Ann &c I will this be a Law
