

The Petition of Thomas Howell of Lees County being ^{read and} debated its order a Bill be brought in for Relief according to the Prayer of the Petitioner
The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning seven O'Clock

Saturday 29th March 1707

The House met again according to Adjournment being called seven were all present as Yesterday
Petition: The Inhabitants of Lunenburg County praying a Town at a Place called Ligonier Road and the Petition granted

Ordered a Bill to be brought in - Another Petition of some Inhabitants of the said County praying a Town to be erected on Catonsent River opposite to Queen Anns Town Road and granted Ordered a Bill to be brought in.

The Petition of some Inhabitants of Calvert County for removing their Court House to Hunting Town in Hunting Creek being ^{read and} debated - And the Petition of some other the Inhabitants of the said County for erecting a Town at Battle Creek and to continue the Court House being likewise read and debated. And Resolved the Court and Court House remain where it now is.

The Petition of George Harris read praying three Acres of Land whereon he has made several Improvements may be taken within the Bounds and Limits of the Town called Nottingham which being debated is granted

The Petition of the Inhabitants on the South Side of Wicocomoco in Somerset County for removing the Court and Town from Green Hill being here read (John Jenkins, Mr. Lewis Donwood, Captain Gale and Mr. Worthington are admitted into the House and being heard what they had to say to the Petition Ordered they withdraw. And there was brought in another Petition of some Inhabitants of Wicocomoco and Nanticoke Hundred for continuing the said Town at Green Hill, being both read and debated: It is Resolved the Town and Court continue where its now erected at Green Hill -

The Hon^{ble} John Hammond and John Edward Lloyd from the Council enter the House and deliver Mr. Speaker a Message relating to Sir Thomas Lawrence and Mr. Dumers Packet Boats with the Lords Commissioners of Trades Letter and Instruction relating to Sir Thomas Lawrence The Consideration is further reported.

The Hon^{ble} Thomas Jench Esq. enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker a Message relating to the Provincial Justice. Ordered it to read and considered of on Monday Morning.

The Hon^{ble} James Saunders Esq. and John Emmatts enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker the following Bills

Bill against counterfeiting foreign Coin of Gold or Silver Indorsed March 29th 1707
