Attorney of the Honble Col Nathaniel Blackiston Agent in England for the
Province humbly remonstrates that his Excellency and the Honble his Majestys
Council in April 1707 recommended to the Honble House of Delegates to
take care and give Directions for Blackiston's Salary for one Year ^{due} in
September 1706 then last past and also for the ensuing Year 1707 should
be allowed by the Committee who were appointed to apportion the Levy in October
1707 upon which his Excellency the Governor was assured by several of the worthy
Members of your House that they had taken care and given Directions therfor
but upon Inspection of Journal of the Committee it appears they made Col.
Blackiston Allowance for the Year 1707 in full and wholly omitted for the Year 1706
which I humbly pray may be allowed him and also for this Year 1708 and that
Directions may be given to the publick Treasurer readily to pay the same
