

And secondly that Authority, being never dilated on the Country, nay, any the Courts of this Province therefore must remain inter *Salva Sacrorum ino Potolia Regum*. Notwithstands his Excellency to show how ready he is to gratify the Country which you represent is willing to pass the Bill ^{now} proposed (that is to say) that the several Courts of this Province have Power to admit and suspend the Attorneys until her Majesty's Pleasure be declared herein always *Salvo Jure Corone*, and that they shall not admit any to practise the Law, who have already been denied that Liberty by his Excellency and this Board and further that none be admitted to practise in any of the Courts of this Province whatsoever but such who qualify themselves by taking the Oaths appointed by Law. Which being read Ordered it be amended accordingly. Which being done Ordered it be indorsed By the House of Delegates December 13th 1708

Read again and will pass as now amended Signed & Order Rich^d Dullam & Co. Dec. 13th Sent up to the Council by Mr Withinson and Mr Covington They return and say they delivered the same The Honble J^{ts} Holland and Philip Lynes Esq from the Council enters the House and delivers Mr Speaker Bill relating to the electing and summing Delegates and the following Message

By the Council in Assembly December 13th 1708

In Compliance with your Message by last Philips and three more of your Members we are willing to pass the Bill for electing Delegates without the Clause obliging the Freeholders, since it is not used in Great Britain, where they are more careful of their Interest. But as to other Clause omitted notwithstanding your Assertion that you can't see it any ways in Derogation to her Majesty's Prerogative we cannot be of your Opinion because it leaves in Dispute a Right in the Crown fully ascertained in the present Law as it now stands, therefore we cannot agree to that Bill as proposed unless you consent to the Addition thereof

Which was likewise read again in the House and past for ingrossing and delivered the Committee of Laws
