Which was read and debated and it is Resolved that the Committee of Laws prepare a Bill to prevent the taking w<sup>t</sup> Cost or any thing more than what is allowed by law for the future. The Committee of Grievances further report

that it is an Agrievance represented to this Committee as an Agrievance that whereas the Lawyers practising the Law in the several Courts within this Province upon the Delivery of a protestado Bill of Exchange (where there are several Indorsements to them by their Clients to be put in Suit for the Recovery of the Debt for which the Bill is drawn together with the Damages of Protest; the Lawyers upon receipt thereof for Laws to themselves without perhaps any Profit to their Clients immediately issues out writs as well against the Drawee as the several Indorsees and prosecutes them to Judgment if not agreed by which means the Charge against the said Drawee and Indorser amounts to more than the Debt Due for which if there was but only one sued the Plaintiff might get his Debt as well as suing the whole so long as it is at his Plaintiff's choice to take either the Drawee or any one of the Indorsees as is best able to pay the Debt demanded All which is humbly offered to the consideration of the Honble House of Delegates to consider thereof

Which being read and debated in the House Resolved it is an Agrievance and referred to the consideration of the next Session of Assembly to remedy the same. The Committee of Laws delivers their Report relating to Blasphemy and some other Affairs therof Vizt. (By the Committee of Laws Thursday 3. Nov. 1709)

In Obedience to the Orders of this House to the Committee appointing them to inspect the Law against Blasphemy and Payment of Criminal Fines etc they are of Opinion that such Persons fall under and be subject to the Methods prescribed in the Act for Payment of Fines due from Criminal Persons.

2 As to that Part of the said Order relating to Fornication and Adultery (as to a lewd woman) they are of Opinion that after the admonition given by the Minister bethy or Church Wardens according to the Tenor of the said Law the continuing to disobey such Admonition sufficiently describes such woman to be a lewd woman

3 And for the last Part of the said Order for the Allowances to Juries and Evidence the Committee are of Opinion that it is necessary a Bill be brought in to ascertain the same
