Bill relating to Imprisonment of Runaway Servants &c Read and committed for Amendments.

All the foregoing Bills were sent to the Honble Council of Mr. Thomas Bordley, Capt. John Wood, Mr. Vanderheyden, Capt. Jones, Mr. Mariattoe and Mr. Worthington for their Honours Concurrence. They return and say they delivered the Bills

An Address brought into the House by Colo. Thomas Smithson relating to keeping the Great Seal &c Read the first and second Time and the House concurs therewith and sent to the Honble Council of Mr. Worthington and Mr. Storey for their Honours Concurrence. They return and say they delivered the same.

Mr. Tyler, Mr. Storey and Mr. Homsley sent up to the Honble Council with a Petition relating to the late Conformance of the Aggrievances &c By the House of Delegates Nov. 5 1709 Upon reading the same Report the House resolved that they concurred therewith and pray her Majesty's Honble to redress the same Aggrievances complained of so far as it is in their Power.
