This Board finding there is already great Dissatisfaction shown to the Bill for relieving  
 Aggrievances are willing and desirous Philomon Lloyd Esq, Deputy Secretary of this Province  
 may be heard thereto in your House before it is Enacted. Signed by Order W Bladen & Co  
 Mr. Secretary appeared in the House and it being so late that he could not have a copy  
 of the Bill he therefore was not willing to hinder the Conclusion of this Session but withdrew

Ordered the following Message be sent to the Council

By the House of Delegates 4<sup>th</sup> November 1710

Our Esteem for the Act for relieving some Aggrievances is still very great notwithstanding  
 its short Duration and we conceive that unless this Act had been past for Inhabitants  
 would continue here and we think the Preamble of the Law sets forth the Necessity of  
 the making of it which is to ease the Aggrievances and quiet the Minds of the Inhabitants  
 of this Province which we hope will preserve your Honours from any Censures at Home  
 for passing it. And the Shortness of Time for which that Act is made will discourage  
 any Persons from making any Interest at Home for its Repeal when her Majesty's Disap-  
 probation if granted cannot probably arrive before the Expiration of it and therefore we  
 conceive the forming an Agent to speak to it an unnecessary Charge
