

The Petition of several poor Debtors being read and debated it's Resolved a Bill to be brought in to confirm and satisfy the Discharges of such poor Debtors as actually were discharged by Virtue of the late Act for Relief of poor Debtors and that the Committee of Laws prepare and bring in a Bill for that Purpose

Ordered the Clerk of this House write to Mr. Amos Ganett to furnish Mr. Richard Young with Clops to hoist the Pr. Flag and charge it to the publick Account

Mr. Samuel Young the Treasurers Memorial being read relating to his being paid as publick Treasurer about Mrs. Fontees Bills of Exchange protested praying Allowance for his Costs Ordered the Committee of Accounts to pay Tobacco

Upon Reading the Message from the Council relating to the Act for Limitation of Officers Fees Resolved the Act disallowed of by her Majesty be reenacted

Bill to reform the ill Practices of High Sheriffs within this Province

Bill reviving and continuing the Militia Act and supplying some Defects therein

Bill appointing how long suspected Runaways shall lie in Prison

Bill to settle and vest Land lying in Calvert County on William Hickman

All these four Bills read the first and second Times by especial Order and indorsed

By the House of Delegates 25<sup>th</sup> Oct. 1711 Read the first and second Times and by especial Order and will pass Signed by Order Rich. Dallam Sec. of the House adjourned till to Morrow Morning Nine o'Clock

The Petition of the Inhabitants of Saint Marys County Court praying Leave to bring in a Bill to revive and continue the late discontinued Process and Proceedings of the said Court Indorsed in Council. By the Honble. Presid. and Council October 25<sup>th</sup> 1711

The within Petition recommended to the House of Delegates That a Bill be prepared for the Relief of the Petitioners. Signed by Order W. Bladen Sec. of Council
