The Reference and Mofage of last Session relating to Colo Blackiston's Salary Read and referred to the Committee of Accounts for Examination and Allowance Mr. Edwards's Petition relating to the work done in the Offices Read and Ordered that Mr. John Salter Mr. Unglo and Mr. Bordley view the work and report the Value thereof to the House

The four Bills read last Night sent up to the Honble Council by Mr. Greenfield Mr. Crabb, Mr. Storey and Mr. Worthington. They return & say they delivered the Bills Ordered Mr. Secretary Lloyd attend this House and shew his Reasons for not removing the Chest of Papers in the School House Cuch according to Order of this House Mr. John Rogers Naval Officer Potowmack District appeared and delivered to the House a List of his Goods.

Ordered Mr. Hunt and Mr. James Bowles attend the Honble Council to see Mr. Rousby prove his Naval Officers Accounts. They return and say they saw him prove his Accounts The Honble Colo Coursey and John Dousey Esqrs from the Council enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker the four Bills sent up to their Honours this Day severally indorsed By the Council October 26th 1711 Read the first and second Times and will pass Signed by Order W^m Bladen S^r Council

Bill for ascertaining the Gauge of Tobacco Acts Read the first Time and Ordered a second Reading

Bill to prevent the cropping and defacing Tobacco on Board of Ships Acted the first Time and Ordered to lye on the Table

John Stacks's Petition from the Honble Council praying Leave to bring in a Bill to supply some Defects in the Will of Mr. Joseph Edwards deceased Read and debated and leave given to bring in a Bill as prayed Colo Greenberry from the Council enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker the following Mofage and some Papers relating thereto

By the Council in Assembly October 26th 1711

By the late Order in Council and Return from St. Colo Gale and Capt. Ballard thereon you will find the Nanticoke Indians are much dissatisfied they may not be permitted to continue at Broad Creek where they are set down, we cannot think prudent to have any Differences with them especially at this Time when our fellow Subjects in North Carolina are at open Rupture with the Tuskaroras and therefore recommend it to your Consideration how to procure their Satisfaction either by purchasing the three thousand Acres they are now possessed or such other means as you may judge of actual thereto.
