This House have considered your Honour's Message about appointing an Agent and since you have so frankly communicated to us your Resolution not to advise the Honble President to pass any Act of Moment, until the Arrival of a next General which in all Probability may be suddenly expected and an Assembly called wherein we expect the many Aggrievances this Province labours under will be redressed and we under a Necessity of having an Agent in Great Britain have Resolved to refuse the appointing any until then and pray your Honour will concur with us herein and if in the mean Time your Honour please to recommend two or three Persons for that Purpose we shall consider thereof
