

Colo. Tilghman enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker Mr. Bradford's Petition which was read with the Indorsement from the Council and ordered to be read

By the House of Delegates 27<sup>th</sup> October 1711 Read and Leave given to bring in a Bill next Session upon making good the Allegations Rich Dullin Mr. Deb. Committee for valuing Mr. Edwards his work enter the House and report it is their Opinion that he deserves thirty three Pounds more than what he is already paid which the House agreed and ordered the Committee of Accounts make Allowance accordingly Guy Meek's Petition brought into the House by Colo. Tilghman Read and referred to the Committee of Accounts for Allowance.

The House adjourned till Monday Morning Nine o'Clock

Monday 29<sup>th</sup> October 1711 The House met according to Adjournment Being called over were present as on Saturday Read what was done on Saturday John Hawkins and Henry Wright's Pet. with Capt. West and Mr. Worthington's Report thereon Read and Leave given to bring in a Bill as a prize

The Message brought into the House on Saturday by Samuel Young and John Dorsey Esqrs Read and debated and the House contradicted the Resolve that they see no Reason to recede from their former Resolve of paying but for two Seals to the Copies of the Laws that are sent to Great Britain

Resolved also That the Public ought not to pay for the Seals of any private Acts, but the Persons in whose Favours such Acts pass ought to pay for the Sealing thereof

The Reference relating to Baltimore County Court House being read and debated its Resolves it be referred for further Consideration to Morrow Morning And Mr. Richard Legate then to report to this House at what Place the Petitioners desire the Court House to be built

Committee appointed to agree with some Person to make a Fence to secure the Town and Country Pasture &c Report to the House that they had agreed with Mr. Thomas Doocura to do the same which he had performed - Ordered the Committee of Accounts allow Mr. Doocura six thousand Pounds of Tobacco for the publick Part of making the said Fence

The House proceeds to consider the Message brought into the House on Saturday relating to the building a Magazine in every County being debated Put to the Question whether such Houses be necessary or convenient to be built or not? Carried by Majority of Votes in the Negative And Resolved that this House will the next Session of Assembly consider of some Method to preserve the Arms and Ammunition

Bill ascertainment the Gauge of Tobacco Hogheads and to prevent cropping and defrauding Tobacco on Board of Ships Read the first and second Times by especial Order Put to the Question whether this Act continue till the tenth of December Anno 1714 or to the 10<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1715 Carried by Majority of Votes till the 10<sup>th</sup> Nov. Anno 1715 and Resolved the Bill pass
