 Bill reviving the Act for relieving some Aggrievances Indorsed By the Council in Assembly Nov<sup>r</sup> 3<sup>o</sup> 1712 Her Majesty having been pleased to signify that the several Bills past in the Assembly held in Nov<sup>r</sup> 1709 were not past according to her Royal Instructions in that they were said only to be Enacted by and with the Advice and Consent of the Council and Assembly and not the President Council and Assembly and therefore having declared them not Enacted by a sufficient Authority and this Bill aiming to receive another Enacted in the same manner it will be contrary to what her Majesty has been pleased to notify to us and of none Effect and forasmuch as the said Bill curtails the Jurisdiction of her Majesty's Courts we cannot think it safe for us at this Time to reenact such a Law but when a Governor in Chief comes fully instructed we shall readily join with you in representing to him what may be for the Benefit and Advantage of this Province
