

Upon the Report of Mr. Tyler from the Committee of Aggravances... Resolved That a Bill be brought in to empower the Sheriff upon Receipt of any Writ of Fieri facias or Attachment to seize two indifferent Persons who are neither of them to the Sheriff or Deft. to appraise the Goods Seized. And if no Appraisers in a little Time to deliver them at such Appraisalment to the Creditors in Satisfaction of the Debt and to oblige the Creditors to accept the same which will prevent the Ruin of many Mens Estates especially such as are in the Hands of Executors or Administrators

Also Resolved upon the Report from the Said Committee that a Bill be brought in to prevent the dilatory Proceedings as well in the Provincial as in the County Courts by obliging the Practitioners and others to be ready for Trial and to allow any Person that will to take out Writs in their own Names and to confess Judgments in their own proper Persons and that no Attorney demand or receive his Fee before the final End of the Cause he is retained in. Mr. Tyler also reports from the Said Committee an Aggravance relating to the Gauge of Tobacco What Read and Resolved it be considered of to Morrow Morning in a full House. The Papers brought into the House relating to Baltimore County Court House Read and debated. Mr. Richard Colegate and Mr. William Talbot and several Gentlemen of that County having Leave appeared in the House and were heard therein and being withdrawn the House Remme contradicente Resolved That a Bill be brought in to settle the Court of that County at the Town of Joppa in the new Court House there built and for settling that Court House on the County and to continue all Process & Proceedings of that Court. Resolved Col^o Maxwell lay before this House the Agreement made with the Justices of Baltimore County for building the Court House; and that in the mean Time the Justices of that County forbear to levy any more Tobacco on that Account. Thomas Hollingsworth's Petition referred from last Session Read, and Col^o Selghmanragan Henry Henderson's Petition Read and by the House rejected.

Moved that a Bill be brought in for encouraging the killing and destroying of Squirrels Debated and put to the Question whether a Bill be brought in or not? Resolved in the Affirmative and that a Roward of four Pounds of Tobacco of Squirrel be levied on the County therefor and that the Committee of Laws prepare and bring in the Bill. Resolved a Message be sent to the Council on the Debates of this House relating to Baltimore County Court House by. By the House of Delegates 5th November 1712. This House have Resolved to settle Baltimore County Court at the new Court House at Joppa, and have ordered Col^o Maxwell to lay before them the Agreement made with the Justices of that County for building that Court House and that in the mean Time the Justices of that County forbear to levy any more Tobacco on that Account to which they desire the concurrence of the Honble Council.
