Ordered Mr James Lloyd and Mr Spragg attend the Honble Council to see Samuel Young Esq. give his Treasurers Accounts. They return and say they saw him from the report of Henry Acton's Petition read praying leave to bring in a Bill to help the heighs of the back of Charles County not recording a Deed from Gilbert Clarke deceased to Walter Beane and referred to the Committee of Laws to examine the Petitioner and report their Opinion therein to the House.

Petition against Ordinary Keepers entertaining Sailors Indorsed By the Council in Assembly Nov. 5th 1712 This Petition is recommended to the House of Delegates. Signed for Mr. Bladen of the Council 6th Nov. 1712 Read in the House and Resolved the Committee of Laws prepare and bring in a Bill to remedy the Grievance complained of in the Petition and that a Clause be inserted in such Bill that no Justice House Officer, Sheriff or Clerk or any of their Deputies live in or keep his Office in an Ordinary or keep Ordinary himself. Signed for Mr. Bladen of the Council

The Honble John Dasey Esq. enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker a Petition of Mr. Colgate, Mr. Hammond, Mr. Talbot and Mr. Stevenson Recommended from the Honble Council. Which being read and debated is by the House rejected.

Mr. William Bladen's Request praying an Allowance for Paper used as Clerk of the Council since the Year 1704. Read and by the House rejected.

The Honble John Whittington enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker the following message several Papers relating thereto By the President and Council in Assembly Nov. 6th 1712

The Honble President and this Board observing how frequently the publick stores are destroyed and imbezled, also the Ammunition sold or otherwise ~~stolen~~ decayed so that it often happens not to be fit for service and that thro' the Mismanagement in the keeping and preserving the same and especially that both the Arms and Ammunition are liable to many unforeseen casualties upon the death of the Commander in Chief of any County where the same are lodged as may appear by the Petition and Depositions herewith sent you we cannot but think it highly worthy the Consideration of this General Assembly to appoint a truste foot House near the County Court Houses in each respective County wherein to lodge the Arms and Ammunition belonging to each County so that they may be more easily viewed (as well by the Justices of the County Courts if they see fit) as also the Commander in Chief of each respective County which will be the best means we can propose not only for the Security and Preservation of the said Arms and Ammunition but also will be a means to keep them well fixed and fit for the Country service.

Ordered Mr. Bladen of the Council Signed for Order Mr. Bladen of the Council Upon reading the aforesaid Message the House took the same into Consideration and having debated it put the Question whether such Magazine Houses are convenient necessary to be built or not? It passed in the negative And Resolved the Arms and Ammunition continue in the Officers hands as they now are until next Session of Assembly

Resolved upon reading the Complaint of the Inhabitants of Charles County and the Depositions relating thereto that Mr. Philomon Hamfroy and Mary his wife Robert and Executive of John Coote late of Charles County deceased, appear before this House at their first meeting the
