

The Honble Cos Greenbury, Col: Addison, Capt. Fitzhugh, John Kasaan John Dwyer Esq<sup>r</sup> enter the House and deliver Mr. Speaker the following Message  
By the Honble President and Council in Assembly Nov: 8<sup>th</sup> 1712

The Honble President having communicated to various Addresses to him for reviving the Law for relieving the Inhabitants of this Province from some Aggravances they lay under and our Sentiments agreeing with yours that in Case such a Law is not now past many good Planters will desert their Estates and others to avoid Imprisonment will be induced to resist Justice and Justice in the Woods whereby the Happy Peace and Tranquility of this Province may be endangered we have been inclined to advise his Honour to consent to the reviving the said Law for the Time proposed purely to avoid the Mischiefs aforesaid to which he is pleased to give way  
Signed by Order Mr. Bladen & Council

Read and Resolved the said Act be revived  
The House adjourned till Monday Morning Nine @ Clock  
Monday 10<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1712 The House met according to Adjournment Being called over were all present as on Saturday Mr. Worthington enters the House Read <sup>will</sup> was done

Resolved upon a Motion made by a Member of this House that a Bill be brought in for the more effectual suppressing the Crimes of Adultery and Fornication peohabiting together of lewd and wicked Persons

The Honble Samuel Young Esq. enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker Bill making good and valid a deed or conveyance made by Edward Stanup to S. Thomas Johnson Indorsed Eodem Die By the Council in Assembly  
Read the first and second Times and will pass Signed by Order Mr. Bladen & Council

Read again in the House and past for ingrossing Henry Acton's Petition with the Report of the Committee of Laws thereon Read and referred till next Session of Assembly & that Gilbert Clark's Heirs have then Notice to appear  
Ordered the ingrossed Bills be read

Bill reviving the Act for imposing three Pence of Hoghead on Tobacco towards defraying the Charges of the Province  
Bill reviving the Act imposing three Pence of Gallon on Rum, Wine, Brandy and Spirits and twenty Shillings of Head on Negroes and Irish Servants

Bill confirming the Probate of John Harrison's Will  
Supplementary Act to the Act for appointing Constables & declaring what Persons are Taxables

Bill for reviving the Act for Encouragement of Tillage and Relief of poor Debtors  
Bill confirming unto Francis Shawood & his heirs an Estate in fee simple of in and to certain lands
