10<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1712 Read and assented to by the House of Delegates & signed by Order Rich<sup>d</sup> Dallam (The Hon<sup>ble</sup>)  
These ten ingrasped Bills sent up to the Honble Council for their Assent by Mr Lloyd Mr Lockman  
Mr Jones and Mr Hammon. They return and say they delivered the Bills

Read the first and second Times by especial Order and will pass

The Honble Colo Whittington and John Hall Esq. enter the House and deliver by Speaker the  
following Message and the Bill therein mentioned

By the Honble President and Council in Assembly Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> 1712

The Honble President and this Board being thoroughly sensible that many great Disorders  
are committed by Indians when in Drink and of the too frequent ill Practice of Persons  
selling them great Quantities of Liquors and also that some evil People have not been wanting  
to raise utter and spread sundry false Reports tending to create Misunderstandings and  
Jealousies between us and them, we have thought fit therefore to recommend the Bill herewith  
sent you for preventing thereof. Further we have thought it expedient to send some  
worthy discreet Persons to the several Nations of the Indians to caution them to advise  
their Indians of the Penalties our Laws inflict upon several Breaches they have made  
thereof and may hereafter be guilty of and that we expect the Offenders should be delivered  
up to Justice upon any just Complaint against them for any Homicides, Larconies, Murders,  
Battoues or the like Misdeemours now by them committed which we hope will be a Means  
to keep them in good Order

Upon reading this Message Resolved it be considered of to morrow —  
Bill restraining the Inhabitants from selling Quantities of Liquors to the Indians  
and from raising false Reports and Rumours relating to the Indians Indorsed by  
the Council in Assembly Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> 1712 Read at the Board the first and second Times  
and will pass

Eodem Die Read in the House the first Time and ordered a second Reading to morrow Morning  
Rich<sup>d</sup> Dallam (The Hon<sup>ble</sup>)

The Honble Samuel Young Esq. and John Doyse Esq. enter the House and deliver by Speaker  
the first six ingrasped Bills sent up this Day severally indorsed Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> 1712 Read and assented  
to by her Majesty's Honble Council in Assembly & signed by Order W Bladen of Council  
The Honble Colo Greenfield enters the House and delivers by Speaker Bill investing Mag<sup>t</sup>  
Hollingsworth and Catharine Wells with an Estate in fee in certain Lands Indorsed  
Eodem Die Read in Council the first & second Times and will pass. W Bladen of Council

The Honble Colo Addison and Colo Pelghman enter the House and deliver by Speaker the four last  
ingrasped Bills sent up this Day severally indorsed Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> 1712 Read and assented to by her  
Majesty's Honble Council in Assembly and signed by Order W Bladen of Council  
Ordered the following Message to be sent to the Council
