

By the House of Delegates October 29<sup>th</sup> 1713

In our Message by Colo Washins and others we did not tax your Honours with any Disregard had by you of any of our Addresses but complain of some Hardships we lye under for want of having that Address presented and very readily acquainted your Honours with our Resolves of addressing her Majesty relating to Sr Tho. Lawrence and upon reading your Message referred from last Session relating to an Agent Resolved upon the employing one on all Occasions; and tho' your Honours do not think fit to join with us in the Address yet we hope you will concur with us in the appointing an Agent and agree to the Conference desired for that Purpose and doubt not but we shall give your Honours such Demonstrations of our Duty and Obedience to her Majestys Commands as will be to your Satisfaction Signed Order

Sent to the Council of Mr. Ward, Mr. Worthington, Mr. Tyler, Capt. Jones, Mr. John Mather and Colo Washins. They return and say they delivered their Message The Honble Samuel Young Esq; from the Council enters the House and delivers Mr. Speaker the following Message By the Honble President and Council in Assembly  
October 29<sup>th</sup> 1713

Resolved That the Honble Samuel Young Esq; and Sr Colo Charles Greenbough join with the Members of the House of Delegates to enquire into the State of the Land and other Records and give them Notice that they will attend that Service to Morrow Morning Signed of Order W Bladen C. Council

Upon reading thereof Ordered the Members of this House appointed for that attend their Honour accordingly

His Honour Mr. Young delivered Mr. Speaker the Petition of Robert Scott Charles Neale of Saint Marys County praying a Bill to supply some Defect in the will of Raphael Heywood late of Saint Marys County recommended from the Council Read in the House and referred to the Committee of Laws to examine the Petitioners Allegations and Pretensions and report their Opinion thereon to the House Bill for Relief of John Cole Read the second Time and will pass The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning Nine O'Clock

Friday 30<sup>th</sup> October 1713 According to Adjournment the House met and present as Yesterday Read what was done Yesterday

Petition of Charles Pasteur Read and granted upon his taking the Oath and Ordered he be put into the Bill with others

Bill for Naturalization of Stephen Rich and others Read the second Time will pass Roger Boyce's Petition Read Mr. Thomas Bordley appeared and by Consent of both Parties Resolved it be <sup>continued</sup> till next Session That an Order issue to the Clerk of Calvert County Court to bring up before this House at their next
