

They return and say they delivered the Bills and saw them sealed. Col<sup>o</sup> Addison and Col<sup>o</sup> Selghman from the Council enters the House and inform the Speaker the Honble President and Council commands him and the whole House immediately to attend him in the Council Chamber and being admitted at the Board Mr Speaker delivered to the Honble President the several Bills agreed upon this Session being in Number fourteen whose Names and Titles follow—
