Mr. Robert Tyler, Mr. John Whittington, Capt. Henry Triggs and Capt. Daniel Mariantoo are appointed a Committee of Aggravances.

Mr. Joseph Hill, Mr. Edward Scott, Mr. Thomas Brooke Junr. and Capt. Thomas Inuoman Greenfield are appointed a Committee of Accounts.
