On a Motion made for Leave to bring in a Bill for the more easy ascertaining and settling of Boundaries of Land and to prevent unnecessary and vexatious Actions, It is Resolved and accordingly Ordered Nemine contradicente That Leave be given for bringing in such a Bill this Session and that the Committee of Laws prepare the same to which said Committee Mr. James Stoddart is added.

Then the House adjourns till One O'Clock in the Afternoon And then met. Present as in the Morning.

Cole Lloyd, Cole Lowrey and Cole Young from the Council deliver Mr. Speaker the following Message. By his Excellency the Gov. and Council in Assembly June 29<sup>th</sup> 1714

Gentlemen, Since the Bill for settling a Revenue upon her Majesty's present Governour has passed all the Requisites in your House as well as at this Board being ingrossed, read, and fully assented to both by your House and this Board and only sent down to you to inform you thereof his Excellency the Gov. with the Advice of this Board has thought fit to require you to lay the said Bill before him whom it properly ought to be laid before for his Consideration thereof
