of 3rd of the Month. I am, Sir, Your Humble Servant J. Hart

Pursuant to which Order the House adjourns to the Council Chamber to see
his Excellency give the Assent on Behalf of her Majesty to an Act for settling a
Revenue on her Majesty's present Governor — Which said Bill his Excellency
the Gov^r was pleased to enact into a Law by sealing it with the great Seal of this
Province and indorsing it ⁱⁿ the following Words viz^t 30th June 1714

On Behalf of her Sacred Majesty Queen Ann of Great Britain &c
I will this be a Law — J. Hart

After which Mr. Speaker with the Rest of the Members returned to the House
and met all present as in the Afternoon

A Bill for Limitation of Officers Fees sent up to the Hon^{ble} Council by Major
Woolford, Capt. Mariants, Major Spigg, Mr. John Whittington, Mr. William Whit-
tington, Capt. Godd, Mr. Vanderheyden, Colo. Hammond, Mr. Monoton Chosoldine,
Capt. Greenfield, John Curnole, James Marshall and Capt. Thomas Downard —
They return and say they delivered the Bill.

Colo. Edward Lloyd, Colo. Holland, Colo. Coursoy, Colo. Young and Colo. Whittington
from the Hon^{ble} Council delivered Mr. Speaker the Bill for relieving the
Inhabitants of this Province from some Aggravations in the Prosecution of
Suits at Law, thus endorsed. June the 30th 1714

Read in Council and will pass with the following Amendments viz^t: To: 5
Instead of above £100 Sterl. or thirty thousand Pounds of Tobs it be expressed
£20 Sterl. or five thousand Pounds of Tobs but above the Sum of two hundred
Pounds of Tobs or sixteen Shillings and Eight Pence Current Money adding
the Wards and give Judgment for the just Balance with Costs of Suit —
